Call for Placement Opportunities



About the program

The University of Michigan Injury Prevention Center will fund five intern positions next summer supporting work in injury prevention. The Center aims to recruit graduate and upper-level undergraduate students interested in injury prevention, offering them an opportunity to gain mentored research or practice-based experience. Internships are funded by the Injury Prevention Center with a student stipend of \$5,700; positions should provide students an opportunity to work approximately 25–30 hours/week (a cumulative total of no less than 300 hours for the summer).

Topic areas eligible for paid intern placement include the prevention of:

-  Opioid overdose
-  Motor vehicle crash
-  Suicide
-  Violence
-  Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)
-  Older adult falls
-  Concussion

Process for summer 2026 internships

You will know if your project has been selected on or before November 17. Students will then have the opportunity to apply to work on your specific project. The IPC will review applicants and select a qualified candidate for you in late January after all student applications have been reviewed.
